Former president Nixon's tax accountant, Arthur Blech of Los Angeles, said yesterday that while Mr. Nixon has a cash problem, he has both tangible and intangible assets that in the end ought to allow hiw to lead a comfortable life.

"It is a cash flow problem which is correctable through rearrangement of the various assets Mr. Nixon owns," said Blech.

For instance, the tax accountantant, said it is financially unthinkable that the former president should continue to maintain both of his homes at Key Biscayne, Fla., and San Clemente.

"I consider it will not be difficult for Mr. Nixon to rearrange his affairs in such a way as to be able to live a normal life within his means and commensurate with his position," Blech said.
