

Ford Doesn't Want His Papers

Washington

President Ford said last night he has no desire to retain his White House papers after he leaves office.

Questioned at his news conference about criticism of a government decision that Richard M. Nixon's White House files are his personal property, Mr. Ford said all his own congressional and vice presidential papers are going to the University of Michigan archives.

"As far as I am concerned, whether they go to the archives or whether they stay the possession of the government, I don't think makes too much difference," he said. "I have no desire, personally, to retain whatever papers come out of my administration."
