

Ford Gets Delay on Pardon Report

Washington

President Ford requested and received a 24-hour extension from a House subcommittee yesterday on its demand for detailed information on his pardon of former President Nixon.

A spokesman for Representative William L. Hungate (Dem-Mo.) chairman of the House judiciary subcommittee studying the pardon, said presidential counsel John O. Marsh Jr. called Hungate Wednesday night and asked for the extension.

The aide added that Marsh indicated he preferred an extension until next Monday, but that Hungate could not resist pressure from other members and granted 2 days only until this evening.
