

3 Prosecutors Named to try Milk Lobbyist

Dallas.

A federal judge appointed three special prosecutors yesterday to try milk lobbyist Jake Jacobsen—a case the Justice Department refused to pursue because of Jacobsen's promise to testify against former Treasury Secretary John Connally.

Jacobsen, a figure in the Watergate investigation, was indicted on charges of misapplication of \$825,000 from the San Angelo (Tex.) First Savings and Loan Association.

Justice Department lawyers have refused to present evidence in the case. They say Jacobsen has immunity from prosecution in all current cases because of his promise to testify against Connally, who was also secretary of the Navy and former Texas governor.
