

Jaworski Favors Airing of Tapes

NEW YORK, Oct. 28, (AP)—Outgoing Watergate Special Prosecutor Leon Jaworski said today he would like to have the White House Watergate tape recordings played on the air so the public could hear them.

"I see no reason why they shouldn't be played on the air. I think that some of the rules of the air would forbid some of them to be played," Jaworski said in an interview on the CBS "Morning News."

Jaworski said he thought Congress could make an exception to the rules against vulgarity on the air if it wanted to.

"I think it takes statutory authority before we could go that far, at least I feel that that is true," he said.
