

Greyhound Fined \$5,000 On '72 Gifts

A federal judge yesterday fined the Greyhound Corp. the maximum \$5,000 for making illegal political contributions to Richard M. Nixon and George McGovern in the 1972 presidential campaign.

Greyhound had pleaded guilty earlier this month to making illegal contributions of \$16,040. Thomas Finney, the firm's attorney, said all but a small part of the money went to Mr. Nixon's re-election committee.

The money was raised through a scheme of awarding double bonuses to Greyhound executives, who had been encouraged by the corporation to make contributions to one of the presidential candidates.

Greyhound was the 17th corporation convicted of making illegal political contributions in the 1972 presidential campaign.

U. S. District Court Judge Oliver Gasch made no comment in imposing the fine, which is against the corporation but none of its executives.
