Deposition by Nixon Canceled

Charlotte, N.C.

Former President Nixon will not have to give testimony about security arrangements for his "Billy Graham Day" visit to Charlotte in 1971.

Charlotte attorney George S. Daly filed papers in U.S. District Court canceling an earlier notice that he would take a deposition from Mr. Nixon on November 26 in Santa Ana, Calif., court records showed yesterday.

Daly refused to comment yesterday on why the deposition was canceled.

Daly represents 21 plaintiffs who have filed a \$1.2 million civil suit against former presidential aides H. R. Haldeman and Ronald H. Walker, former advance man William Henkel Jr.; the Charlotte Police Department, the U.S. Secret Service and members of the Veterans of Foreign Wars who policed the rally.

The plaintiffs contend their rights were violated when they were denied entry to the rally.
