## A Nixon Diehard Is Voted Out

Washington

When Richard M. Nixon's last tapes disclosure led to wholesale defection from his cause, Representative Earl Landgrebe (Rep-Ind.) said, "I'm sticking by my president even if he and I have to be carried out of this building and be shot."

Mr. Nixon was forced to resign. Yesterday the voters in Indiana's northeastern corner turned Landgrebe out of office.

Landgrebe, 58, was denied a fourth term in Congress by a decisive margin. He lost to Floyd J. Fithian, 45, a professor of democratic history at Purdue University.

"After Mr. Nixon's resignation, the only three votes against the House Judiciary Committee's final report on impeachment were cast by Landgrebe and Democratic Representatives G. V. (Sonny) Montgomery of Mississippi and Otto E. Passman of Louisiana.

Montgomery and Passman were unopposed for re-election.
