

# Milk Officials Arrive at Prison

Montgomery, Ala.

Two former officials of the nation's biggest dairy cooperative arrived at a federal prison camp here yesterday to begin serving terms for illegal election campaign contributions.

Superintendent Robert Grunski said Harold S. Nelson and David L. Parr checked in during the afternoon at the prison compound at Maxwell Air Force Base.

Nelson and Parr, former top executives of Associated Milk Producers, Inc., were sentenced to three years in prison and fined \$10,000 each by U.S. District Judge

George L. Hart Jr. in Washington on November 1, but all but four months of their prison terms were suspended.

They had pleaded guilty to making contributions to the campaign of Senator Hubert H. Humphrey (Dem-Minn.) and Representative Wilbur Mills (Dem-Ark.), among others.

It was the first time in the Watergate scandals that anyone had been sentenced to prison for illegal campaign donations. Others had been let off with fines.
