NYTimes 10V 2 9 1974 Weicker Asks Sirica To Cut Dean's Sentence

WASHINGTON, Nov. 28
(AP) — Senator Lowell P.
Weicker Jr. has asked United
States District Judge John J.
Sirica to reduce the sentence
of John W. Dean 3d, former
White House counsel.

In a letter released by Mr.
Weicker's office late today,
the Connecticut Republican
said, "Whatever hurt John
Dean did his fellow countrymen was more than replaced
by the risks which he took
on their behalf."

Mr. Weicker said he understood that Mr. Dean had
moved or soon would move
for a reduction in his oneto four-year prison term for
obstruction of justice in the
Watergate cause. Judge Sirica imposed the sentence.

Mr. Dean, Mr. Nixon's
chief accuser on Watergate,
began serving his term Sept.
3 at a Federal institution in
Maryland.

"I have known John Dean
since May of 1973," Mr.
Weicker wrote. "Since that
time I have heard this young
man step out from under
the protection of the most
powerful office in the world
to tell the truth of the abuse
of that office to the American people."
