While the cover-up trial continued in a courtroom across
the hall, Mr. Mitchell testified
about disputed wiretaps authorized in a narcotics case in 1970
while he was Attorney General.
The 10 defendants in the case
have moved to have their indictments quashed on the
ground that Mr. Mitchell did
not authorize the wiretaps that
produced most of the Government's evidence against them.
Federal law requires that
wiretaps be authorized by the
Attorney General or an assisant.
