Scott Says Tapes Show Nixon Lied to Him in '73

WASHINGTON, Dec. 9 (UPI)
—The Senate Republican leader, Hugh Scott, said today that President Nixon had lied to him the White House involvement. He said Mr. All the White House was involved."

Senator Scott said tapes solayed for the jury in the Watergate cover-up trial showed that Mr. Nixon misinformed him on March 20, 1973, he same day Mr. Nixon dissussed the existence of such involvement with H. R. Haldenan, then White House chief of staff.

"I did not know on March 20, 1973, that the President of the United States had lied to me," Mr. Scott told reporters today. He said that after a morning meeting, with Mr. Nixon, he went before newsmen and white House involvement. He said Mr. Ford was out of contention, later damaging Mr. Scott's credibility with some newsmen. Mr. Scott said he did not subsequently accuse Mr. Nixon of lying to him on that occasion, but said it was "at the very least an evasion."

Nixon nominated Geraid R. Ford as Vice President Mr. Scott said he was called tothe White House, where Mr. Nixon feared a Republican leadership battle in the Senate. The Senator said he then asked whether Mr. Ford, then House minority leader, was disqualified for the same reason. "He said 'Sure', Mr. Scott said. Later that day, Mr. Scott in-
