Asked for a personal assessment-of-any-evidence gathered by the Rockefeller commission bearing on a possible C.I.A. role in the Kennedy assassination, Mr. Belin replied:

"Thus far, I have found no hard evidence whatsoever to indicate that, there was any person involved in the assassination of John F. Kennedy other than Lee Harvey Oswald."

Mr. Hunt, who is preparing to return to prison following the failure of an appeal seeking to overturn his conviction, reportedly testified in a closed session with Rockefeller commission investigators on Wednesday. nesday.
