# Protests As Dean Speaks At Davis

About 75 protesters drowned out the first phrases of a talk by Watergate figure John Dean last night at the University of California's Davis campus.

About 1800 persons paid \$1.75 and \$2.50 to hear the 35-year-old Dean speak.

There were no incidents or arrests as the marchers paraded in front of Freeborn Hall on the campus demanding that Dean's \$3500 fee be sent to the Attica Brothers Legal Defense Fund.

Craig McNamara, 24, said the marchers were not against Dean's appearance.

"Our point is just that the legal system favors the rich and powerful. The people without power wind up in jail and people with power like Dean go free," he said.

Dean was released from jail on January 8 after serving five months of a one-to-four year sentence. He had been housed in a minimum security prison at Fort Holibird, Md.

Dean told the students, "Not too many years ago I was out there as a student just like you, and as anonymous, and I never anticipated what would befall me.

"While I have no credentials to preach or moralize, I thought if I tell other young people what I went through and about my mistakes, they can have their own Watergate and perhaps they won't react like I did."
