Nixon Is Indicted for Lying

CHICAGO, Aug. 16 (AP)—
The president of the Chicago
Public Library Board has been
indicted on charges of lying to
Internal Revenue Service agents
in connection with Richard M.
Nixon's historical papers.

Ralph J. Newman, a literary
appraiser and Lincoln scholar,
was hired by Mr. Nixon to
appraise papers that the former
President was donating to the
United States Archives.

A one-count indictment was
returned this week charging
that Mr. Newman lied three
times to I.R.S. investigators
who questioned him on the
Nixon papers in late 1973 in
Chicago. Mr. Newman already
is under indictment on charges
of helping falsify Mr. Nixon's
