

Nephew of Nixon Cited With Vesco In U.S. Subpoena

DETROIT, Nov. 22 (AP) — Robert Vesco, the fugitive financier, and Donald Nixon Jr., who is a Vesco aide and a nephew of the former President, are among the subjects of a Federal grand jury's investigation into heroin smuggling, according to a subpoena.

Alwyn L. Eisenhauer, a 48-year-old former pilot for Mr. Vesco, appeared before the jury Friday. The subpoena that summoned him, a copy of which was seen by an Associated Press reporter, ordered the pilot to bring with him all records, documents and other materials "relating to the heroin smuggling activities of Robert Vesco and Donald Nixon Jr. and others." 22 NOV

In a telephone interview Saturday, Mr. Eisenhauer declined to disclose what he had told the grand jury, but he said that he did not have any reason to believe that Donald Nixon Jr. had smuggled narcotics.

He said that the nephew of former President Richard M. Nixon had been urged to leave a communal way of life in California and join Mr. Vesco's crew "because the President didn't want to embarrass him."

Representatives of the United States Attorney's office in Detroit declined to comment on the case.

Mr. Vesco lives in Costa Rica, where he sought refuge after having been charged by the Securities and Exchange Commission with defrauding Investors Overseas Services of \$224 million. At last report, Donald Nixon Jr. was also living in Costa Rica.
