At Lompoc, Calif., Dwight Chapin left prison on parole yesterday after serving seven months and 22 days for perjury before the Watergate grand jury. The former appointments secretary to Richard M. Nixon had been sentenced to 30 months—reduced on appeal to 18—responsibility in connection with campaign “dirty tricks” carried out by Donald Segretti. Mr. Chapin, aged 36, left prison by a back door, avoiding the press, and was expected to join his wife and children in Chicago.
