"I wouldn't have done it if it hadn't been a slow news day, or if it had been raining and would have gotten people's cameras wet. I apologize to my friends in the press," said Abel, who has pulled similar stunts before in Washington and New York.

Abel said the "Bill" who claimed to be "Deep Throat," the shadowy source in Bob Woodward and Carl Bernstein's "All the President's Men," was really Bill Daprado, a professional actor.

Abel said he staged the hoax to pro-Abel said he staged the hoax to promote his new movie, "The Faking of the President," a satiridal Documentary" of 20 televised news conferences by Richard M. Nixon, in which the former President's answers are resynchronized to depict admisions to various contrived crimes.
