## New and Recommended

## FICTION

BACKWARD TO THE FRONT OF THE DAY, by James Robson. A tight, solid novel about a group of standard characters who behave in a way that is not standard.

BRUNO'S DREAM, by Iris Murdoch. The mystery and the fear of death provide the theme of this story built around an 80-year-old man who is dying.

THE COLLECTED STORIES OF JEAN STAFFORD, by Jean Stafford. Thirty brilliant short stories, written during the last quarter-century, their settings as varied as their characters.

HOWARD STREET, by Nathan C. Heard. Narcotic addicts, prostitutes, their pimps and the lost, against a setting of tenements and bars along a street in Newark, N. J.

THE NAME OF THE GAME IS MURDER, by Eliot Aslnof. A murder-mystery, the corpse in the case being provided by the coach of a New York pro-football team which has lost 13 games.

## GENERAL

POETS ON STREET CORNERS: PORTRAITS OF FIFTEEN RUSSIAN POETS, by Olga Carlisle. A personal anthology, linking two generations of Russian poets by more than 250 poems.

THE TRAGEDY OF LYNDON JOHNSON, by Eric F. Goldman. A readable account of the last Administration by a historian who was a White House aide for almost three years.

ZAPATA AND THE MEXICAN REVOLUTION, by John Womack Jr. The definitive biography of Emiliano Zapata and the years (1910-1919) of the revolution in Morelos.
