"Rush to Judgment: A Critique of the Warren Commission's Inquiry into the Murders of President John F. Kennedy, Officer J. D. Tippit and Lee Harvey Oswald," by Mark Lane will be published by Holt, Rinehart and Winston on Aug. 15. Mr. Lane, a New York lawyer who presented a brief in behalf of Oswald to the commission, questions the findings of the inquiry.

"Spoken Like a Frenchman," by Arthur Train Jr., which will be issued by Doubleday on Aug. 5, is a guide to French colloquial expressions. It contains 46 lists of words and phrases in current use under such varying categories as insults, love and the church. The publishers recommend the book for anyone who has learned French in school and now would like to be able to talk with French people.

"Kingdom of the Tides," by Samuel Carter 3d, will be released by Hawthorn on July 15. Mr. Carter tells not only what is known and unknown about the tides but also what was thought about them in ancient times and how they have figured in history.

Psychology and Law

"Law and Psychology in Conflict," by James Marshall, will come from Bobbs-Merrill on July 27. The author is a lawyer who is adjunct professor of public administration at New York University. He writes that research shows that human beings have little ability to observe, recall or describe events as they really happened. As a result, he declares, evidence accepted under the legal system has little relationship to reality.
