

**Sorensen Disputes Article  
By Manchester on Kennedy**

Theodore C. Sorensen, once a special assistant to President Kennedy, disputed Thursday a passage referring to him in a magazine article by William Manchester, author of "The Death of a President."

In the April 4 issue of Look, Mr. Manchester asserted that Mr. Sorensen, while writing his book "Kennedy," was "racing

to acquire Kennedy [family] approval."

Mr. Manchester wrote, "Ted took the easy way, giving way on point after point and weakening what should have been a great volume. I had a small stake in Ted's book. I worked on the epilogue, and I spent two hours begging him to hold his ground. He refused."

"There is not one word of truth in that," Mr. Sorensen said in an interview. "There

was no two hour meeting. There was no censorship by the Kennedys. There was no giving way. What he says is incredible."
