"The Glass House," by James J. Wadsworth, will be published by Praeger on March 8. Mr. Wadsworth spent eight years in the "Glass House" — the United Nations headquarters — as Deputy to Henry Cabot Lodge and later as Chief of the United States Mission. Mr. Wadsworth tells of the international struggles that make headlines at the United Nations, but he also makes the point that while 80 per cent of the United Nations news is about crisis and controversy, 80 per cent of United Nations activities deal with impressive economic and social projects that are not often in the news.
