O'Brien Balks at Publication

Another book on the late
President Kennedy is
coming out this year,
creating the usual
amount of bad blood all
round.

The contract for a book on Kennedy's political career was signed three years ago by three members of the "Irish Mafia" — Lawrence O'Brien, Kenneth O'Donnell and David Powers. Now O'Brien, after spilling 60 hours of reminiscences into a tape recorder, has flatly refused to give his consent for publication.

The other two are livid. For O'Brien is the outstanding example of the Kennedy man who has accommodated to the ethos of Lyndon Johnson, and kept his hand on the hem of power.

He accommodated so well that in 1964 he privately supported Hubert Humphrey for Vice-President against Robert Kennedy. So well, that O'Brien, now Postmaster-General, may be given control of the Democratic National Committee.

In other words, entrusted with the sacred task of obtaining LBJ's re-election to the White House next year.

Today, O'Donnell and Powers are in a mood of publish and be damned. They intend to jettison O'Brien's contribution and bring the book out in the autumn.
