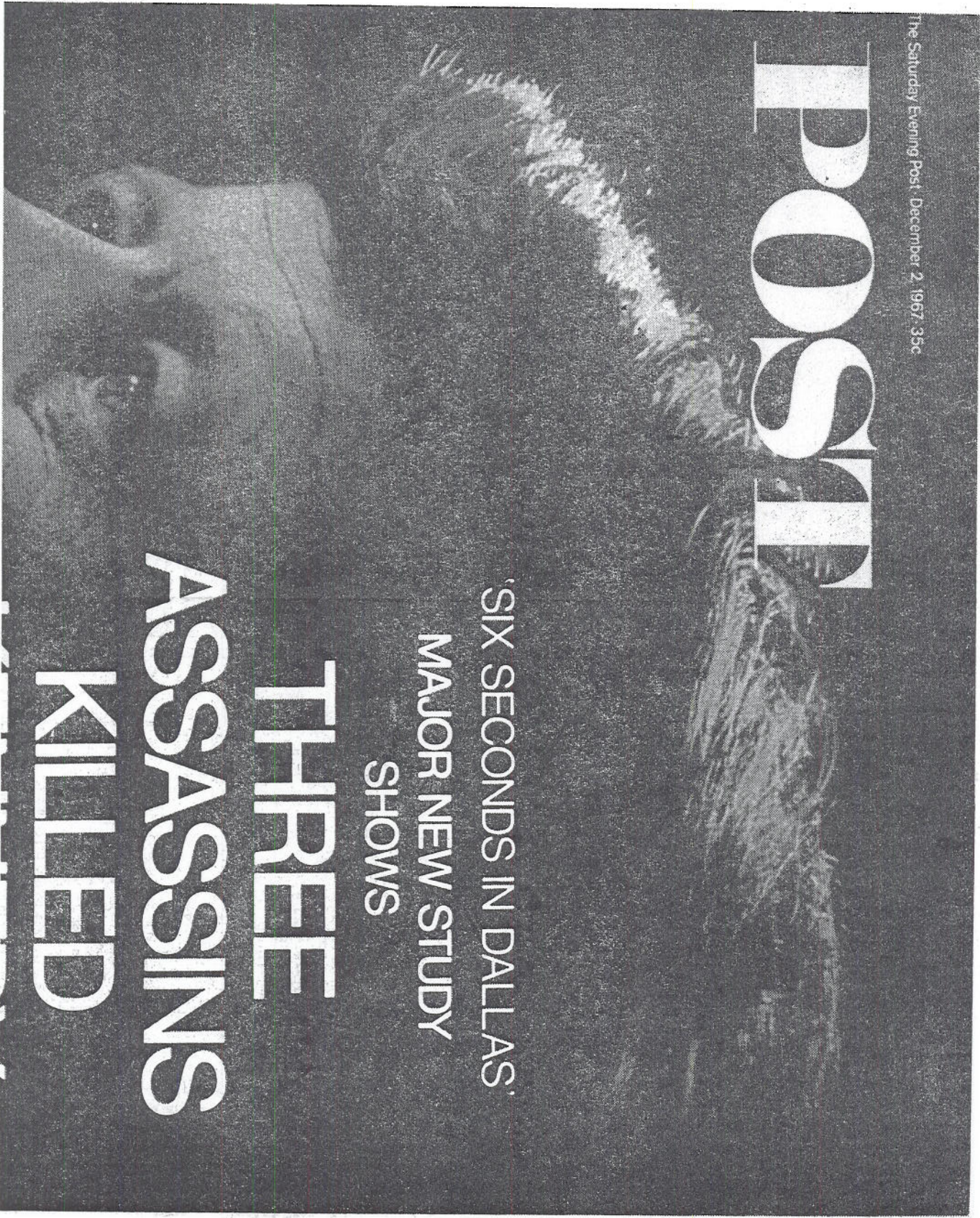

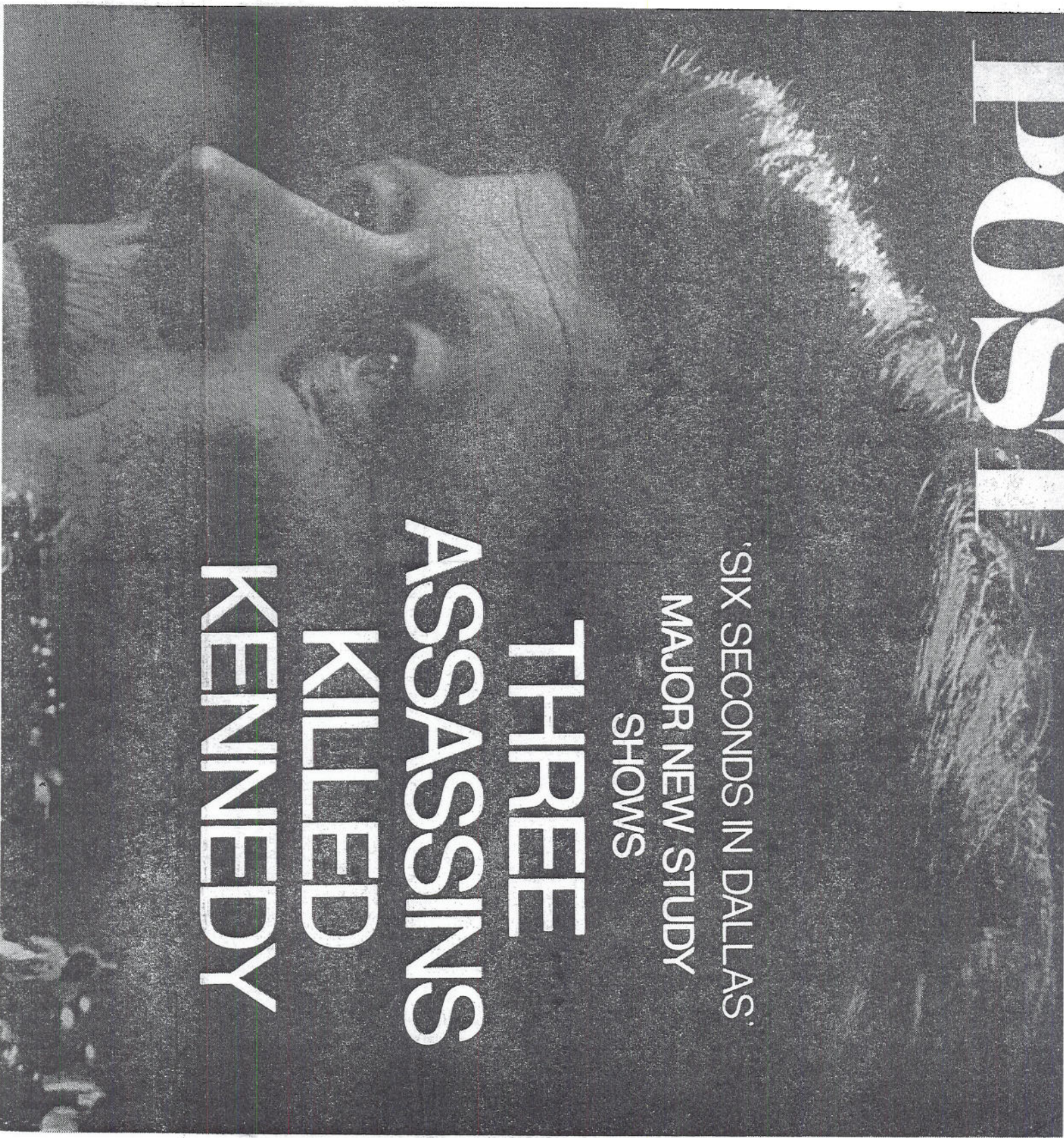

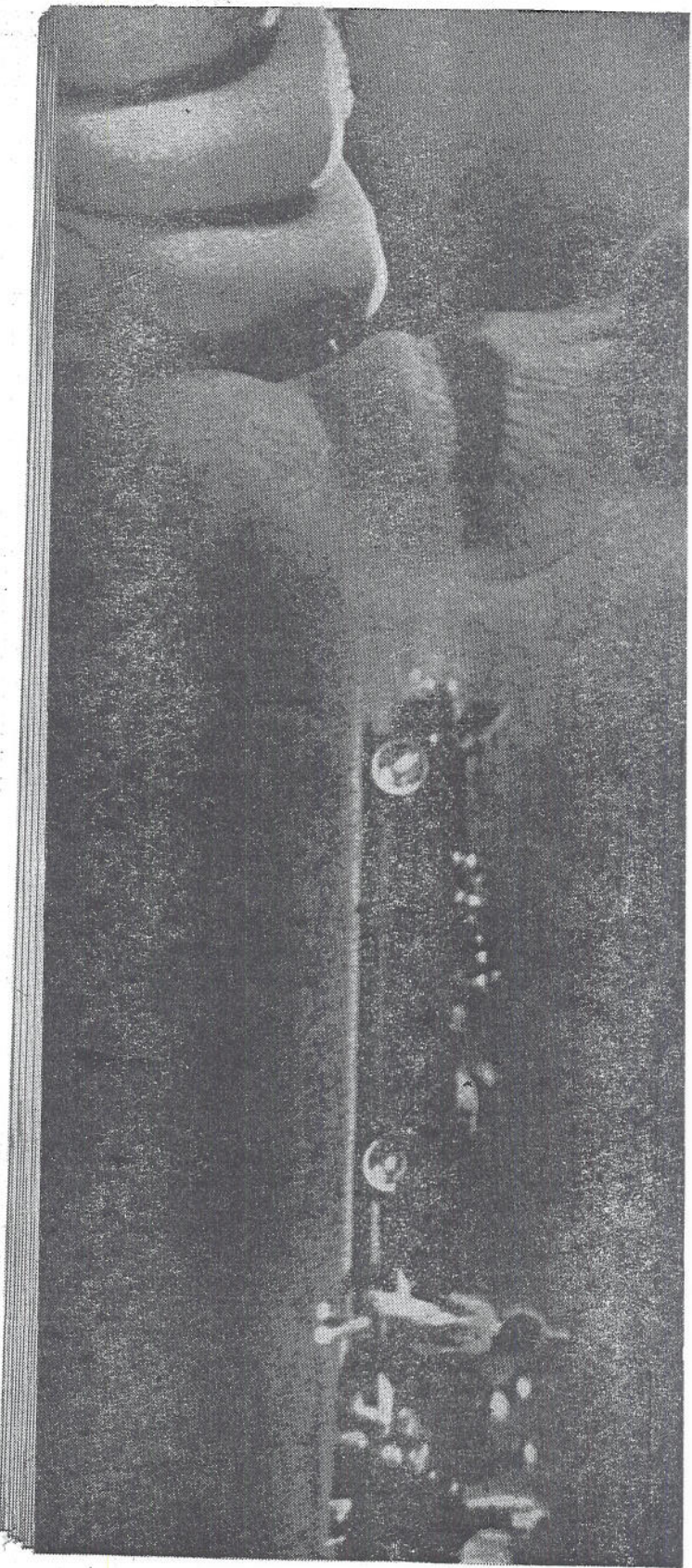

# New evidence on the assassination

It is not easy to get back to the horrible business of the assassination of President Kennedy. But we must do it. As Americans, as people everywhere, we reflect on the shame of that painful moment on November 22, 1963. We wish for at least the small satisfaction of knowing that the truth has been laid bare and the facts have been made final for all to see.

But that wish has not yet been fulfilled. And as responsible journalists, we feel it is our duty to present what we believe to be compelling evidence that the President was not killed by one tortured man, but by at least three assassins and at least four bullets.

In the December 2 issue of the POST we are publishing a major excerpt from Josiah Thompson's book, *Six Seconds in Dallas*, which presents new evidence

and new concepts that persuasively argue that the findings of the Warren Commission Report are wrong. With painstaking care and perception, Thompson clinically constructs his case to reveal a whole level of contradictory evidence (much of it never published before) that lay buried beneath the facile conclusions of the Warren Report.

Truth is a tradition at the POST. Our millions of readers expect it, demand it. By publishing a major portion from Thompson's book, we reaffirm our dedication to that great tradition. We do not believe that the Kennedy mystery has been solved or that the case should be closed.

We urge you to read this study with the same sense of responsibility with which we are publishing it.
