Handling of JFK Data Scored

Author Harold Wiesberg accused the government yesterday of repeated "dishonesty and deception" in the face of a series of lawsuits to obtain evidence concerning the assassination of President Kennedy.

Wiesberg made the charge in an affidavit concerning his latest lawsuit to acquire scientific tests conducted on bullets, bullet fragments and arti-

cles of clothing involved in the Kennedy assassination.

The FBI has maintained that it provided Wiesberg with all the data he sought following the filing of the suit in February, but Wiesberg protested that the documents contain references to still other tests that have yet to be furnished.

A longtime critic of the Warren Commission's investigation of the Kennedy assassi-

nation, Wiesberg also said an FBI affidavit filed recently by special agent John W. Kilty indicates that neutron activation tests may have been conducted on clothing worn by the President and by Texas Gov. John B. Connally on Nov. 22, 1963, when Kennedy was killed and Connally wounded. Wiesberg said he has not been supplied with any data on these tests.
