

Dallas, Dec. 2 (AP) - An Associated Press photograph of President Kennedy's shooting aroused new interest here and abroad because it seemed to show a man resembling his accused assassin, Lee Harvey Oswald, standing at ground level behind the motorcade. However, authorities said today the man in the picture is not Oswald.

Oswald was accused of shooting the President from a sixth floor window of the Texas School Book Depository building where he was employed.

The picture taken by Associated Press photographer James Altgens shows a man peering from the entrance of the building at the moment the President was shot.

Comment on the resemblance came from many parts of this country and abroad.

If the man in the picture actually had been Oswald, it would seem to prove that he was not the Kennedy assassin because he would not have had time to reach the entrance.

However, R.S. Truly, superintendent of the Book Depository building, identified the man in the picture as Billy Lovelady, another employe of the firm. Truly declared:

"At first glance this does look like Oswald. But after looking it over I knew it wasn't. They don't even look alike. I showed the photograph to Lovelady, who said 'Yes, that's me.'"

The Federal Bureau of Investigation said it also had investigated the photograph and that the man shown in the building entrance is not Oswald.

DALLAS, DEC. 2 (AP)—AN ASSOCIATED PRESS PHOTOGRAPH OF PRESIDENT KENNEDY'S SHOOTING AROUSED NEW INTEREST HERE AND ABROAD BECAUSE IT SEEMED TO SHOW A MAN RESEMBLING HIS ACCUSED ASSASSIN, LEE HARVEY OSWALD, STANDING AT GROUND LEVEL BEHIND THE MOTORCADE. HOWEVER, AUTHORITIES SAID TODAY THE MAN IN THE PICTURE IS NOT OSWALD.

OSWALD WAS ACCUSED OF SHOOTING THE PRESIDENT FROM A SIXTH FLOOR WINDOW OF THE TEXAS SCHOOL BOOK DEPOSITORY BUILDING WHERE HE WAS EMPLOYED.

THE PICTURE TAKEN BY ASSOCIATED PRESS PHOTOGRAPHER JAMES ALTGENS SHOWS A MAN PEERING FROM THE ENTRANCE OF THE BUILDING AT THE MOMENT THE PRESIDENT WAS SHOT.

COMMENT ON THE RESEMBLANCE CAME FROM MANY PARTS OF THIS COUNTRY AND ABROAD.

IF THE MAN IN THE PICTURE ACTUALLY HAD BEEN OSWALD, IT WOULD SEEM TO PROVE THAT HE WAS NOT THE KENNEDY ASSASSIN BECAUSE HE WOULD NOT HAVE HAD TIME TO REACH THE ENTRANCE.

HOWEVER, R.S. TRULY, SUPERINTENDENT OF THE BOOK DEPOSITORY BUILDING, IDENTIFIED THE MAN IN THE PICTURE AS BILLY LOVELADY, ANOTHER EMPLOYEE OF THE FIRM. TRULY DECLARED:

"AT FIRST GLANCE THIS DOES LOOK LIKE OSWALD. BUT AFTER LOOKING IT OVER I KNEW IT WASN'T. THEY DON'T EVEN LOOK ALIKE. I SHOWED THE PHOTOGRAPH TO LOVELADY, WHO SAID 'YES, THAT'S ME.'"

THE FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION SAID IT ALSO HAD INVESTIGATED THE PHOTOGRAPH AND THAT THE MAN SHOWN IN THE BUILDING ENTRANCE IS NOT OSWALD.
