

Notes on People byline, Albin Krebs

John F. Kennedy's brother, Senator Edward M. Kennedy, and sister-in-law, Ethel Kennedy, laid bouquets of chrysanthemums on the former President's grave at Arlington National Cemetery yesterday, to commemorate the 11th anniversary of his assassination in Dallas. They stood quietly in the chill wind for about five minutes, as about 50 tourists watched, then went to the grave of Robert F. Kennedy, Ethel Kennedy's husband, and laid a bouquet there. . . . In Dallas, the anniversary was marked quietly with prayers and the laying of a wreath at the Kennedy Memorial, about 400 yards from where Mr. Kennedy was shot. In a eulogy, Mayor Wes Wise said "He advocated an open forum for dissent; it was a perversion of this freedom that killed him."
