David Hackett

"According to Kennedy staff members in Washington, there had been a party on Chappaquiddick Island .. for David Hackett, a friend of Robert Kennedy."

"The man in charge of the 'boiler room,' was David Hackett, a close friend of .. John F. Kennedy. Sources said Mr. Hackett did not attend the party on Chappaquiddick Island .. Friday night."

David Hackett was one of the pallbearers at Miss Kopechne's funeral. The others were six of her cousins and K. Dun Gifford, EMK's legislative assistant.

David Hackett named by Edmund J. Rooney ("an experienced investigative reporter who has been at Edgartown .. since [21 Jul]" ) as having been at the party, in addition to the other six men. Rooney says party consisted of seven men and six girls.

"A ... source close to the Senator said that the six men included the crew of the ... The source did not identify the crew, but the records of the ... listed five names: [EMK, Gargan, Markham,] Edward Martin and ..."

"Sources close to the Kennedy also said that Edward Martin, one of those registered at the Edgartown Inn ... as a member of the Senator's crew, never ... the trip to Martha's Vine and left weekend for the annual regatta."

Shiretown Inn

"About 2 p.m. [EMK] checked into room 7 on the second floor of Mayberry House, a restored 18th Century frame building that is part of Shiretown Inn in Edgartown."

"It was also learned today that Senator Kennedy's party had five rooms at the Shiretown Inn on the night of July 18. Three of these appeared to have been occupied by married couples who did not take part in the cookout...\* The hotel's records show that these rooms were registered in the names of John P. Driscoll, Ross Richards and Henry Carr. Mr. Parker, one of the inn's managers, said all three were friends of Mr. Kennedy but could not otherwise identify them. He said that the reservations were made in early June."

Questions

□ NYTimes 29 Jul (last item above) does not give the names for the other two rooms reserved for EMK's party. If all five rooms were in the Shiretown Inn, two are not accounted for. If any of the five was in the main house section of the inn, one presumably was that of EMK for the one and a half rooms.

□ If the room in which the party was held was registered? If the registration was made by EMK, it should show this.

□ If the room was registered, was it registered on July 18?
