Actor 'Doing Well' Following Surgery

Doctors report actor Robert Taylor, 58, is doing "very well" after removal of his right lung as the result of a fungus infection known as valley fever.

A spokesman at St. Paul's Hospital in Hollywood said it was still undetermined whether small tumors found in surgery Tuesday were malignant.

Jackie Guards OK'd

The Senate has voted to provide Mrs. John F. Kennedy with Secret Service protection until her death or she remarries.

The action, subject to House approval, would extend the same protection to her children until they reach the age of 16.

Existing law calls for Secret Service protection for the widow of a president for four years after he dies in office. The four years expired in Mrs. Kennedy's case November 1967. Protection since

then has been on a year to year basis.

Ike to Get Saute

Former President Dwight D. Eisenhower, whose 78th birthday is Monday, will receive a block-long birthday card.

In connection with national Salute to Eisenhower Week Oct. 13-20, the Abilene, Kan., Reflector-Chronicle is sponsoring a Salute-to-Ike signature project.
