Including the 202 fulltime servants, Sparks said the accountant reported the homes would have cost the Onassis' about \$2 million alone in upkeep and another \$2 million in real estate and other taxes. In addition, he said annual upkeep on the \$7 million yacht Christina cost the Greek magnat about \$1.4 mil-

lion.

Explaining how two individuals could spend at a rate of \$384,615 a week, the author said Mrs. Onassis recently redecorated the Glyfada villa for between \$750,000 and \$1.25 million. Onassis bought that villa in 1962 for opera star Maria Callas, who lived there until May of 1968 when she left in a rage on learning of Onassis' plans to marry the widow of the late President John F. Kennedy.

It was reported Mrs. Onassis undertook the redecoration to rid the dwelling of memories of Miss Callis, a former companion of her husband.
