Jackie's lesson on JFK's death

NEW YORK — "One must not let oneself be numbed by sadness," says Jacqueline Kennedy Onassis in the November issue of McCall's magazine. In an article written for the 10th anniversary of John F. Kennedy's death, she said, "He would not have wished that."

Her 14-paragraph introduction to a series of reminiscences about the late President does not mention the assassination.

"For those who shared his days it is too painful to look back," she said. "But for the young it can be helpful.

"That is why I care about his library (the John F. Kennedy Library, to be built in Cambridge, Mass.) It can't replace him, but it can help people believe "it's not too late to seek a newer world." God grant us always young people who feel that way. That is my prayer.
