

## Bobby, Wife Pay Visit To Grave

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Sen. Robert F. Kennedy, D-N.Y., and his wife Ethel made an early morning visit today to President John F. Kennedy's grave on a frosty hillside at Arlington National Cemetery.

The late President's brother laid a pink rose on the grave. His wife brought two small simple bouquets — one of lilies of the valley, the other of white and gold chrysanthemums.

They knelt in prayer at the grave for about five minutes before leaving. Only a few reporters and photographers were present and the photographers acceded to a request by Mrs. Kennedy not to take any pictures of her and her husband at the gravesite.

The temperature was in the 20's and the grass was white with frost in many places as the senator and Mrs. Kennedy arrived at the cemetery at 7:15 a.m. The cemetery does not open until 8 o'clock but guards opened the gates for them.

The sun was barely above the horizon as the two proceeded to the grave about a quarter of a mile from the cemetery entrance.

Sen. Edward M. (Ted) Kennedy, D-Mass., the slain President's other brother, was half-way around the world on this third anniversary of the assassination. He and his wife, on an African tour, were honor guests for a memorial ceremony in an Algiers square re-named for Kennedy.
