At the end of almost a week of skiing with 7 of her 11 children on Mount Tecumseh, near Waterville, N. H., Mrs. Ethel Kennedy took a fall and broke her right leg in two places.

One of two men who witnessed the accident on the "expert" slope of the mountain said "she was doing a cartwheel and landed on her back."

A ski patrol took Mrs. Kennedy to a ski lodge infirmary, where two orthopedic surgeons set the leg. There'll be no more skiing this year.

Ethel Kennedy, widow of the late Senator Robert Kennedy, was reported in excellent condition yesterday at Scea Speare Hospital after fracturing her lower right leg Sunday in a skiing accident.

Dr. Henry Crane, one of the physicians treating her, said that about 20 minutes after the accident, the leg was set in a clinic at the Waterville Valley ski area, north of Plymouth.

Mrs. Kennedy, 43, was later brought to the hospital here by ambulance, he said.

She will be able to leave the hospital any time within the next few days, but will have to use crutches for a while, the doctor said.
