

'Deputies Told to Tag RFA Cars'

Los Angeles - (AP) - Sheriff's deputies were encouraged to issue citations to the motorcade of the late Senator Robert Kennedy during his 1968 presidential campaign since he was not considered pro police, a former sheriff's deputy says.

Freston Guillery, 27, a deputy from 1966 to 1969 told the Assembly Select Committee on the Administration of Justice yesterday that a sheriff's sergeant told officers under him to issue tickets to the Kennedy motorcade.
