

Kennedy Wins... Then Tragedy

Sen. Robert F. Kennedy surged to victory in California's Democratic presidential primary early today, only minutes before his triumph turned into violence and tragedy.

Kennedy had just told his jubilant supporters, "We can end the violence in our society. We can start making this a compassionate country. I intend to make this the basis for my running."

Moments later gunfire felled the Senator in the crowded kitchen off the Embassy Room in the Los Angeles Ambassador Hotel, making his victory almost meaningless.
