Senate **Breaks Tradition**

WASHINGTON — (UPI) -The Senate, in a rare break with tradition, met today within hours of Sen. Robert F. Kennedy's death to authorize Secret Service protection for major presidential candidates.

The move broke a longstanding precedent that the Senate does not transact business on the day a member dies.

Senate Democratic leader Mike Mansfield said he had been in touch with the Ken-nedy family and "they said this is what Bob would like to have done.

He said the Senate would stand adjourned tomorrow as a "further mark of respect"
