

Exit Permit For Father Of Sirhan

The Israeli military governor of Ramallah yesterday granted an exit permit to Bishara Salameh Sirhan, father of the man accused of assassinating Senator Robert F. Kennedy.

The permit allows Sirhan to cross the Allenby bridge into Jordan, but it is expected that he will proceed from there to the United States for the trial of his son due to begin in Los Angeles on June 28.

The elder Sirhan is a resident of Taibeya village which is in the Ramallah subdistrict. The permit will enable him to return to the Israel-occupied West Bank of the Jordan whenever he chooses. Sirhan is a Jordanian citizen.

The Israeli authorities refused to comment on a story published Thursday in the London Evening Standard alleging that a certain Arab government has submitted to the FBI additional facts on Sirhan Sirhan which contradict some of the biographical notes on him which had been published earlier including two secret trips to the Middle East.
