'Indication' 1 Shot Was Not Sirhan's

Los Angeles

The attorney for Sirhan Sirhan said yesterday there is evidence that someone besides the condemned assassin fired at least one of the shots which struck Senator Robert F. Kennedy.

Luke McKissack said. "There is some indication another weapon was used."

He said criminologists with whom he had consulted believed that one of the bullets which struck Kennedy "was different from ones in some of the other victims."

McKissack emphasized that he was not denying that Sirhan was present in the kitchen of the Ambassador Hotel and that he fired a gun with the intention of killing the presidential contender.

McKissack said he is calling for a complete investigation of the ballistics tests used in the Sirhan case and would ask permission for his own ballistics experts to test-fire Sirhan's gun.

His news conference came in the midst of a police department investigation into charges of incompetency lev-
