Dear Friend:

The Citizens' Committee of Inquiry has undertaken an independent investigation of the assassination of President Kennedy with the commitment that all of the information we discover will be made available to the public. That promise has not been as easy to carry out as we had hoped. Although we have released much startling new evidence to the press, we have yet to read any comprehensive and accurate news story in the American press dealing with the questions raised by our investigation.

On March 4, the Chairman of the Citizens' Committee of Inquiry, Mark Lane, appeared before the Warren Commission and presented the material he had assembled to that body. Before doing so, however, he first requested that his testimony be given in a public hearing; his request was granted and the Warren Commission on that afternoon held their first and last open session.

Mark Lane presented to the Commission documents, photos and eyewitness reports on the medical evidence, the shooting of Patrolman Tippit, the doctored photos allegedly showing Oswald with the murder weapons, the site of the assassin(s), and many other disturbing questions. His report has yet to be covered by the American press, although many representatives of the media were present for his testimony.

In order to make available to the public all the evidence he presented to the Warren Commission, Mr. Lane has recorded his actual testimony before the Commission on two 12-inch LP's just released by Folkways Recording Company. The boxed album entitled "The Oswald Case: Mark Lane's Testimony to the Warren Commission," includes an 8-page transcript of the record's contents. This album is now available from the Citizens' Committee of Inquiry at the special price of \$5.95 plus 25¢ postage and handling charges.
