Suit Asks Rockwell Burial In National Cemetery Plot

In National Cemetery Plot

ALEXANDRIA, Va., Feb. 8
(UPI) — The American Nazi
party filed a suit in Federal
District Court today in a renewed effort to have the ashes
of its slain leader, George Lincoln Rockwell, buried in a
national cemetery.
Philip Hirschkop, an attorney
for the American Civil Liberties
Union, filed the petition on behalf of the party and its new
chief, Matt Koehl.
The court was asked to direct the Defense Department
to permit interment of Rockwell's ashes at the Culpeper,
Va., national cemetery "or any
other national cemetery except
Arlington."
Rockwell was shot to death
Aug. 25 at a shopping center
in the Washington suburb of
Arlington, Va. A former party
member, John Patler, 30 years
old, was convicted of murder
in the case last December.
