MIAMI, FLA., MARCH 11 (AP)-THE CUBAN NATIONALIST MOVEMENT, AN EXILE ANTI-CASTRO GROUP THAT SAYS IT HAS STRUCK BEFORE IN CANADA AND OTHER COUNTRIES, CLAIMED "CREDIT" TODAY FOR THE BOMBING OF A MONTREAL AUCTION HOUSE AND WARNED MORE SABOTAGE MAY FOLLOW AT EXPO 67.

"WE ARE INVOLVED IN MUCH MORE IMPORTANT WORK IN OTHER PARTS OF THE WORLD," SAID FELIPE RIVERO, HEAD OF THE MOVEMENT.

RIVERO SAID THE MONTREAL BOMBING OCCURRED BECAUSE CONFISCATED BELONGINGS OF REFUGEES FROM CUBA WERE BEING AUCTIONED.

THE EXILE LEADER SAID "I HOPE THEY KEEP THIS IN MIND WHEN THE CUBAN PAVILION AT THE CANADIAN FAIR OPENS ITS DOORS IN A FEW DAYS."

RIVERO RECALLED THAT HIS GROUP SHELLED THE CUBAN EMBASSY IN OTTAWA WITH BAZOOKAS LAST OCTOBER AND REMARKED:

"IT IS NOT OUR INTENTION TO TURN CANADA INTO THE PRIVATE PLAYGROUND OF THE CUBAN NATIONALIST MOVEMENT, BUT IF THE CANADIANS KEEP PUSHING US WE DON'T HAVE ANY OTHER CHOICE."

RIVERO SAID HIS GROUP HAS ATTACKED COMMUNIST CENTERS IN ARGENTINA, MEXICO AND OTHER COUNTRIES. HE CALLED THE "MONTREAL AUCTION OF STOLEN GOODS" A "BLOODY INSULT TO THE TRAGEDY OF THE CUBAN PEOPLE, OVERRUN BY COMMUNISM."

RIVERO ADDED: "WHAT MAKES OUR PEOPLE MORE BITTER IS THE FACT THAT THE AUCTION WAS BEING HELD IN A NON-COMMUNIST COUNTRY SUPPOSED TO BE IN THE DEMOCRATIC WESTERN BLOC."

THE 43-YEAR-OLD ANTI-CASTRO LEADER DECLARED THAT THE CANADIANS AND EVERYONE AROUND THE WORLD WANTING TO MAKE A PROFIT OUT OF THE CUBAN TRAGEDY SHOULD TAKE THIS INTO CONSIDERATION.

"IF THEY WANT TO GO ON WITH THIS TYPE OF CONDUCT, THEY WILL DO IT AT THEIR OWN RISK," HE SAID.

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
