NEW YORK (AP)--STATE ATTY. GEN. LOUIS J. LEFKOWITZ SAID SUNDAY HE RECOMMENDED THE RECENT FILING OF A BILL OUTLAWING SUCH PARAMILITARY ORGANIZATIONS AS THE MINUTEMEN IN NEW YORK STATE.

VIOLATORS WOULD BE SUBJECT TO UP TO 15 YEARS IN PRISON. LEFKOWITZ SAID THE BILL WAS FILED BY STATE SEN. SAMUEL GREENBERG, D-BROOKLYN, AND ASSEMBLYMAN WILLIAM F. LARKIN, R-MANHATTAN, AFTER A NINE-MONTH INVESTIGATION BY HIS OFFICE. THE PROBE SHOWED "SHOCKING EVIDENCE OF VIOLENCE, POTENTIAL GUERRILLA WARFARE AND THE DISCUSSION OF POSSIBLE ASSASSINATION OF PROMINENT PUBLIC OFFICIALS," LEFKOWITZ SAID.

HE SAID IN A STATEMENT HIS INVE

STIGATION ALSO SHOWED THAT MEMBERS OF THE MINUTEMEN HAD DISCUSSED THE POSSIBLE ASSASSINATION OF VICE PRESIDENT HUBERT H. HUMPHREY, CHIEF JUSTICE EARL WARREN AND GOV. NELSON A. ROCKEFELLER.

THE BILL DEFINES A PARAMILITARY ORGANIZATION AS ONE NOT AN AGENCY OF THE FEDERAL OR STATE GOVERNMENT, BUT WHICH ASSEMBLES TO ENGAGE IN SIMULATED OR REAL MILITARY TRAINING.
