Minutemen Chief Sentenced To 10 Years on Arms Counts

ALBUQUERQUE, N. M., Oct. 10 (AP)—Robert DePugh, leader of the Minutemen organization, was sentenced today to nine concurrent Federal prison terms of 10 years each on nine counts of violating Federal firearms regulations.

DePugh and an aide, Walter Peyson, were arrested by Federal. Bureau of Investigation agents in July, 1969, after the agents raided a house and found silencers, bombs and grenades.

DePugh was convicted by a Federal Court jury Sept. 25
