Bombing NL

LOS ANGELES AP - The conservative National States Rights Party was abruptly evicted from an auditorium where it was meeting Saturday after protests by the militant Jewish Defense League set off a skirmish resulting in seven arrests.

In addition, occupants of a hotel adjoining the Embassy Auditorium were evacuated after a telephoned bomb threat during the afternoon meeting.

Earlier, in Saturday's pre-dawn hours, a small bomb exploded outside the auditorium, breaking a few windows. The Jewish group has labeled the states' rights group a neo-Nazi organization.

Just after the morning explosion, the Associated Press received a telephone call from a man who said, "I have a news release. I just blew up the Embassy Ballroom because the National State's Rightists - the Nazis - are coming there. If they come I'll blow them up again."

The caller concluded by saying, "Never again, never again," the slogan of the JDL, best known for its protests of treatment of Soviet Jews.

Police were on hand in case of trouble when the meeting convened. A skirmish among JDL pickets and about 75 spectators broke out, and at least seven were arrested for investigation of offenses including resisting arrest.

The manager of the auditorium-hotel, Planaria Knill, said she stopped the meeting after a phoned bomb threat forced her to evacuate 252 occupants of the hotel - mainly elderly persons who live there.

"I received a call at 2 p.m. from someone saying a bomb would go off at 2:30," said Miss Knill. Police searched the building but found no bomb.

"I had to cancel the meeting because of the threat to everyone in the building," Miss Knill said. She said the states' rights members left peacefully.
