LEADERS OF SENATE OPPOSE A VISIT BY KY

WASHINGTON, Sept. 17
(Reuters — Senate leaders totay urged Vice President Nguyen Cao Ky of South Vietnam to cancel his plans to speak at a right-wing rally in Washington, Oct. 3.

Senator Gordon Allott, Republican of Colorado, who is chairman of the Republican Policy Committee, told the Senate that it was wrong for an official of a foreign government to attempt to tamper with the political process and public opinion of another country.

The Senate Democratic leader Mike Mansfield of Montana, agreed, saying he was in favor of cancellation of the visit.

Vice President Ky was invited to Washington by the Rev. Carl McIntyre, rightist evangelist, to address a rally. Opponents of the war are planning counter-demonstrations, and the Nixon Administration is reported to be opposed to the visit.
