

McIntire Plans Big Rally Against Peking on U.N. Day

WASHINGTON, July 21 (AP) —The Rev. Carl McIntire announced plans today for a rally here Oct. 23 against the admission of Communist China to the United Nations.

The Fundamentalist minister from Collingswood, N. J., told a group of about 100 demonstrators on the Capitol grounds that a national effort would be made to bring to Washington on United Nations Day "the biggest gathering we've ever had." The theme for the rally will be "human freedom versus human slavery," Dr. McIntire said.

Today's demonstration was in protest against President Nixon's plan to visit China.

"The President said that he would seek to establish normal relations with Red China," Dr. McIntire said. "But no one seeks normal relations with a murderer who has announced that he intends to kill you."
