

SF Chronicle files MMe. Ngo Dinh Nhu

Aug. 9, 1963 (NY Times svc) Saigon — Charged the U.S. Embassy "threatened and blackmailed" the Ngo Dinh Diem government to muzzle her.

Described newly-arrived Henry Cabot Lodge as "stubborn." "We shall see."

Sept. 8, 1963 -- Siagon, announced she coming to U.S.

Sept. 8, 1963 -- Belgrade, after arrival, dined with Sen. Ted Kennedy. (both were attending the Interparliamentary Union).

Oct. 7, 1963 -- arrived New York.

Oct. 20, 1963 -- In Washington, where addressed National Press Club but not the White House. (No invitation).

Oct. 23 -- Arrived in Dallas. Spent the night at the Beeville ranch of oil millionaire Dudley +. Dougherty.

Los Angeles -- Oct. 31, 1963

Oct. 29, 1963 -- In San Francisco, addressed UC students at Berkeley and the Commonwealth Club. Bruce Baxter III, 24, of wealthy oil family in Texas and nephew of Dougherty, accompanied the party, escorting daughter Le Thuy.

Nov. 2, 1963 -- President Ngo Dinh Diem and husband Ngo Dinh Nhu assassinated in Siagon.

Nov. 2, 1963 -- Los Angeles, Mme/ Nhu said the coup "couldn't have happened without American incitement and American backing."

Nov. 14, 1963 -- Left LA for Rome.

Nov. 25, 1963 -- sent message to Mrs. Kennedy regarding JFK assassination Nov. 22.
