MILITARY-CIVILIAN

WASHINGTON, JUNE 10 (AP)-WARNING THAT A MILITARY JUNTA MIGHT SOMEDAY TRY TO TAKE OVER THE U.S. GOVERNMENT, SEN. VANCE HARTKE, D-IND., URGED THE SENATE TODAY TO DEFEAT A BILL WHICH WOULD PERMIT A GENERAL TO HEAD THE FEDERAL AVIATION AGENCY.

HARTKE OPPOSED A WAIVER ASKED BY PRESIDENT JOHNSON IN THE LAW WHICH REQUIRES THAT A CIVILIAN HEAD THE FEDERAL AVIATION ADMINISTRATION.

JOHNSON PLANS TO APPOINT GEN. WILLIAM F. MCKEE, RETIRED FOUR-STAR AIR FORCE GENERAL, TO HEAD THE FAA.

THE HOUSE ALREADY HAS PASSED THE WAIVER BILL AND IT HAS BEEN RECOMMENDED BY THE SENATE COMMERCE COMMITTEE OF WHICH HARTKE IS A MEMBER.

HARTKE CONTENDED THAT THE LATEST REQUEST IS JUST ANOTHER STEP IN VIOLATION OF THE TRADITIONAL AND CONSTITUTIONAL SYSTEM OF CIVILIAN CONTROL OVER THE MILITARY.
