'Stun Guns' Recovered; Couple Accused of Theft

MIAMI, Oct. 1 UPI)—The police have recovered seven of nine electronic "stun guns" and arrested a young couple in connection with their theft and use in a service station holdup two weeks ago.

Elzabeth Ann Bruce and Thomas Pannier, both 24 years old weer arrested at their apartment yesterday after William Lawson, 27, the holup victim, identified Miss Bruce from a police mug file.

The weapon used in the holdup was subsequently traced to a Miami Beach distributor that had been burglarized Sept. 12. Nine of the flashlight-like guns were allegedly taken in that burglary, but the police only recovered seven from the PannierBruce apartment yesterday.

The stun guns — so-called because they shoot out dart-tipped wires that discharge a 50,000-volt electrical shock that immobilizes the victim—can be obtained only through the manufacturer.
