TA ASKED 220

FORT WORTH, TEX., APRIL 12 (AP)-AUTHORITIES SAID TODAY AN INVESTIGATION IS CONTINUING IN THE WEEKEND SLAYING OF GOVERNMENT ENGINEER E. M. GLASS.

POLICE EARLIER IN THE WEEK IDENTIFIED A .22 CALIBER TARGET PISTOL FOUND OUTSIDE THE FASHIONABLE SOUTHWEST SIDE HOME AS THE MURDER WEAPON.

GLASS, 43, A PROJECT ENGINEER FOR THE ARMY CORPS OF ENGINEERS, WAS FATALLY WOUNDED AS HE SAT IN A BED AT HIS WEDGEWOOD HOME ABOUT 1 A.M. SUNDAY.

THE VICTIM'S WIFE TOLD INVESTIGATORS SHE STRUGGLED WITH AN INTRUDER IN THE DARKENED HOUSE MOMENTS BEFORE HER HUSBAND WAS SHOT.

MR. GLASS SAID SHE PICKED UP A PISTOL NEAR THE BED AND HAD GONE TO INVESTIGATE A NOISE WHEN SHE ENCOUNTERED A HUGE MAN IN A DOORWAY. THE MAN KNOCKED HER DOWN, SHE SAID, GRABBING THE PISTOL AS SHE FELL.

"I MUST HAVE BEEN OUT A FEW SECONDS," SHE SAID. "THE PISTOL DISCHARGED AND A BULLET HIT THE FLOOR. I HEARD SEVERAL BANGS, BUT I WAS DAZED AND DON'T KNOW JUST HOW MANY."

SHE BROKE INTO TEARS AS SHE TOLD OF FINDING HER MORTALLY WOUNDED HUSBAND.

POLICE, ARRIVING AT THE SCENE, FOUND GLASS' STEPSON, DAVID WHITE, 18, RUNNING FROM THE HOUSE WITH A RIFLE. THEY QUOTED HIM AS SAYING:

"MY FATHER'S DEAD! SOMEONE MAY STILL BE INSIDE THE HOUSE!"

THERE HAVE BEEN NO ARRESTS.
